





Artikutza valley

Artikutza valley is among the best preserved areas in the Cantabrian cornice. In 1919 the municipality of Donostia-San Sebastian acquired this 4000 ha valley in order to guarantee good quality water supply to the town. Since then, has been managed in conservationist way: only water supplying was allowed in the valley. Due to this management policy, today, Artikutza is almost completely covered with high quality forests and hosts an enormous biodiversity. Nevertheless, Artikutza valley has a black spot called Enobieta Reservoir. It was built in the 1950's to supply drinking water to the province of Gipuzkoa. There is a 42 meter tall dam that stores 1.63 hm³. Enobieta Reservoir has been unmanaged since the Añarbe Reservoir was built further 1976. Structural downstream in problems. aggravated by decades of neglect, prompted the municipality of Donostia - San Sebastian to decommission the dam. As far as we know, it is the largest removed dam in the Iberian Peninsula and this offers a unique opportunity to assess the effects of dam removal in one of the best preserved river systems of the Cantabrian cornice. In addition to this, in the afternoon we plan to visit the Albaola shipyard, where whaleboats constructed were with wood extracted from the valley.


